A. God's Intervention -

A	light from heaven: Acts 9:4 And he fell to the earth, and heard a voice saying unto him, Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me? Acts 9:5 And he said, Who art thou, Lord? And the Lord said, I am Jesus whom thou persecutest: <i>it is</i> hard for thee to kick against the pricks. Acts 9:6 And he trembling and astonished said, Lord, what wilt thou have me to do? And the Lord <i>said</i> unto him, Arise, and go into the city, and it shall be told thee what thou must do. Acts 9:7 And the men which journeyed with him stood speechless, hearing a voice, but seeing no man.					
1.	Saul, with theicial papers from Jerusalem's religious leaders in hand, is on his journey to Damascus to find andprison the Little Flock believers.					
2.	Saul's trip will revolutionize not only his life, but the itself. Saul has an entourage with him to help in the many arrests he is planning to make happen. Also, because of the vival happening in Samaria, Saul is the more infuriated and determined to put as many as he can in prison.					
3. But God had otherexpected plans for Saul. As Saul approaches Damascus (which probabl in sight), a blinding light, bright as the, shines and causes Saul to fall to the ground.						
	*A Hebrew voice from heaven speaks to Saul. It is the voice of Jesus Himself! Jesus, the One Saul thought was dead - and was so embittered against, was speaking to him.					
4.	Isn't it amazing that Jesus did not Saul? Instead, Jesus speaks and reasons with Saul. It is a conversion that <u>begins in</u> , <u>but ends</u> in conversion with life-changing faith.					
	a. [Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou?]					
	b. [And he said, art thou, Lord?]

5. In one moment of time, Saul's beliefs crumbled to the ground. All that he thought wa (a false Messiah, Law, Temple, Jesus' believers, Israel's favor, his own purpose for Judaism) wa all!						
	*The only truth he knew now, or was sure of at that moment, was that Jesus Christ was and alive. Personally, I believe Saul was converted at that very moment.					
6.	Paul later describes this conversion and commission to Agrippa:					
	Acts 26:12-18 - Whereupon as I went to Damascus with authority and commission from the chief priests, Acts 26:13 At midday, O king, I saw in the way a light from heaven, above the brightness of the sun, shining round about me and them which journeyed with me. Acts 26:14 And when we were all fallen to the earth, I heard a voice speaking unto me, and saying in the Hebrew tongue, Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me? <i>it is</i> hard for thee to kick against the pricks. Acts 26:15 And I said, Who art thou, Lord? And he said, I am Jesus whom thou persecutest.					

unto whom now I send thee, Acts 26:18 To open their eyes, and to turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan unto God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins, and inheritance among them which are sanctified by faith that is in me. *Later Paul shares that <u>He had</u> Jesus: <u>I Corinthians 15:8</u> - And last of all he was seen of me also, as of one born out of due time. b. Saul's co-persecutors saw only the light and heard a voice. Evidently they could not make out was being said, <u>nor</u> was speaking (Acts 22:9, 9:7). 7. As we can see, God did not raise up Paul to be under or a part of the ministry. Paul was raised up as a apostle to proclaim the message for today. Ephesians 2:12-13, 15-16 - That at that time ye were without Christ, being aliens from the common wealth of Israel, and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope, and without God in the world: Eph. 2:13 But now in Christ Jesus ye who sometimes were far off are made nigh by the blood of Christ. Eph. 2:15 Having abolished in his flesh the enmity, even the law of commandments contained in ordinances; for to make in himself of twain one new man, so making peace; Eph. 2:16 And that he might reconcile both unto God in one body by the cross, having slain the enmity thereby: <u>Dr. Wm. R. Newell:</u> "The failure or <u>fusal</u> to recognize the Pauline gospel as a separate, new revelation, and not a development from Judaism, accounts for of the confusion in many people's minds today as regarding just what the gospel is!" "Unto none of the 12 apostles did God reveal the great body of doctrine for this age. It pleased to be the great proclaimer and revealer of just what the Gospel is for this God to choose dispensation. Paul's constant testimony to the fact that he had a special message from God cannot be overlooked. No other apostle speaks of '_____ gospel'. And it is according to the revelation given to Paul that believers are established." Romans 2:16 - In the day when God shall judge the secrets of men by Jesus Christ according to my gospel. Romans 16:25 - Now to him that is of power to stablish you according to my gospel, and the preaching of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery, which was kept secret since the world began, II Timothy 2:8 - Remember that Jesus Christ of the seed of David was raised from the dead according to my gospel: *With Paul's conversion, we have the ginning - the dawn - the _____ of the Dispensation of Grace. We will ually see this truth unfolding from Acts 9 on. Remember: Matthew 12:31-32 - Wherefore I say unto you, All manner of sin and blasphemy shall be forgiven unto men: but the blasphemy against the Holy Ghost shall not be forgiven unto men. Matt. 12:32 And whosoever speaketh a word against the Son of man, it shall be forgiven him: but whosoever speaketh against the Holy Ghost, it shall not be forgiven him, neither in this world, neither in the world to come.

Acts 26:16 But rise, and stand upon thy feet: for I have appeared unto thee for this purpose, to make thee a minister and a witness both of these things which thou hast seen, and of those things in the which I will appear unto thee; Acts 26:17 Delivering thee from the people, and *from* the Gentiles,

	*The nation Israel this <u>in early Acts</u> , culminating with the stoning of Stephen. Israel committed the <u>unpardonable sin and even Paul</u> was guilty of blaspheming. Paul could not have been forgiven under the vious old economy - the Prophetic Program to Israel. <u>But God</u> created a new dispensation of grace, making Paul the one to be saved under it.					
	<u>I Timothy 1:13, 16</u> - Who was before a blasphemer, and a persecutor, and injurious: but I obtained mercy, because I did <i>it</i> ignorantly in unbelief. <u>1Tim. 1:16</u> Howbeit for this cause I obtained mercy, that in me first Jesus Christ might shew forth all longsuffering, for a pattern to them which should hereafter believe on him to life everlasting.					
Saul's Continued Journey To Damascus -						
Ac	ets 9:8-9 - And Saul arose from the earth; and when his eyes were opened, he saw no man: but they led him by the hand, and brought <i>him</i> into Damascus. Acts 9:9 And he was three days without sight, and neither did eat nor drink.					
1.	Saul enters Damascus very differently than he had planned. Instead of riding in as Jerusalem's persecuting hero, Saul enterslessly blinded and led by the hand.					
	*God has seemingly <u>crushed Saul</u> , but he will in total dedication to Christ.					
2.	As Jonah was in the whale's belly 3 days and 3 nights and as Jesus was buried 3 days and 3 nights, Saul has 3 days to flect on his startling conversion experience. Saul needed to reconstruct his past beliefs and how they fit with his spiritual life.					
3.	It is also important <u>to notice</u> that since God is going to send Saul to the nations-Gentiles, God saves and calls Saul-Paul on Gentile <u>away from the</u> and away from Jerusalem.					
	Galatians 1:11-12, 15-19 - But I certify you, brethren, that the gospel which was preached of me is not after man. Gal. 1:12 For I neither received it of man, neither was I taught <i>it</i> , but by the revelation of Jesus Christ. Gal. 1:15 But when it pleased God, who separated me from my mother's womb, and called <i>me</i> by his grace, Gal. 1:16 To reveal his Son in me, that I might preach him among the hea then; immediately I conferred not with flesh and blood: Gal. 1:17 Neither went I up to Jerusalem to them which were apostles before me; but I went into Arabia, and returned again unto Damascus. Gal. 1:18 Then after three years I went up to Jerusalem to see Peter, and abode with him fifteen days. Gal. 1:19 But other of the apostles saw I none, save James the Lord's brother.					
4.	Paul is to be the apostle mainly to the Gentiles.
